AMERICAN CULTURE IN THE 60's and 70's

The purpose of this course is to give students an in-depth understanding of the inter-connectivity, interdependence, and influence of events, people, movements, etc., by examining a time of great change. The class will be interdisciplinary, involving history, music, film, literature, Women's Studies, fashion, and more.

CIVICS AND ECONOMICS SURVEY

You will learn the principles of Civics and Economics through "living" them. Class will begin with discussion of relevant concepts, and then those concepts will be applied as you engage in simulations to experience economics and participate in government. For example, you will learn about the stock market through "buying" and "selling" the stocks in our portfolio.

MATH OPTIONS

This class is organized so that students may practice basic math and pre-algebraic concepts OR further skills in Algebra and Statistics. The first level includes properties of operations: reading and interpreting data; fractions, decimals, and percent; negative numbers; the coordinate plane; and ratios, rates, and proportion. The second level includes equations and geometry; systems of equations; expressions with exponents; exponential growth and decay equations; quadratics and polynomials; irrational numbers; and statistics and probability. Students will work on-line in and out of class; there will be small group activities for students working on the same topic. Final grade is based on math skill achievement, plus attendance and effort.

PLATO/SUPPORTED ONLINE INSTRUCTION

Edmentum PLATO is an online learning program with a great array of subjects to satisfy required or elective credits. Each PLATO course is self-paced and completed independently. The ADP instructor will be available to support students during the scheduled class time and will monitor and assess all online work. Plato classes are accessible 24/7. The average student may spend as many as 50 hours to complete a course (0.5 or 1 Credit). Students who prefer to study in person or who are falling behind should take advantage of the in-person study hall on Tuesdays from 5:30 - 7:30 p.m.

FEE CATEGORIES (please circle one)

1. Night Student/Option 1 - A 16/17 year old student pursuing the Keene Community Education Adult Diploma through evening classes only, but still considered enrolled in their home high school (Most home schools pay the tuition for these students. If not, \$215).
2. Dual Enrolled/Option 2 - a 16 to 18 year old student never withdrawn from high school, pursuing the Keene Community Education Adult Diploma diploma through daytime high school classes and Community Education evening classes (Most home schools pay the tuition for these students. If not, \$215).
3. Home Schooled Student/Option 3 - a home schooled student aged 16 or 17, not affiliated with a public high school (\$215).
4. Adult/Title II Student/ADP - A student 18 years or older taking classes to earn an Adult Diploma (no charge).
5. In-school Youth - Still enrolled in high school and taking an additional class for credit to transfer back to the high school with the goal to accelerate graduation date. Intends to graduate from their home school, and takes no more than 2 classes (\$215).
